ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT COMMON PRINCIPLES

BACKGROUND

Canada, British Columbia and the Ktunaxa Kinbasket Treaty Council are engaged in treaty negotiations in the British Columbia Treaty Commission process. Our treaty negotiations include public consultation and internal review of documents jointly drafted by the three Parties.

This document is part of a group of chapters which will form the Agreement-in-Principle and will acquire greater context over time. It has not been finalized and is subject to change.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT Common Principles

- 1 The Parties acknowledge and agree that the determination of Citizenship is a significant matter to the [Ktunaxa Nation] and should be determined by the Nation.
- 2 The Parties agree that the eligibility criteria and Enrollment process will identify Ktunaxa Treaty participants.
- 3 The Parties agree the eligibility criteria and Enrollment process should be capable of withstanding legal challenges.
- 4 The Parties agree that enrollment will be through a process that is:
 - 4.1 open;
 - 4.2 transparent;
 - 4.3 fair;
 - 4.4 Affordable; and
 - 4.5 in accordance with negotiated eligibility criteria
