Individual Training Plan: What it is, how it works... for you.

An ITP is required for Ktuanxa clients to access supported services including: Funding applications, work-experience positions, job shadowing, job coaching, skills development plans, etc.

The ITP ensures that both you and the employment counselor have thoroughly thought about the career or employment goals and have agreed upon an action plan

to achieve your goals.

The initial intake process takes an hour or two and in the end a plan is developed that clearly defines the steps to achieve your goal(s), including timelines and roles for both you and your case worker.

This event was on February 2, and we had a great turnout. Thank you all who attended!


The open house had presenters from our industry partners, and Ktunaxa Nation sectors including TKL and Economic.
